the Gaming Machine Technical Standards (GMTS) with Nigel supporting GB in this work Plans around the GMTS review are taking a two-phased approach. • Phase 1 - Consolidate the existing 12 technical standards into a single document and amend the style of format to align with the remote tech standards. Currently drafting that consultation document and targeting a publication in Spring. There are some potential interdependencies with DCMS. An area that could come up is cashless and there is the ability to include some cashless consultation within Phase 1. GB thanked GBG members for the	
 Phase 2 – looking at potential player protections on gaming machines in areas such as limit setting which is voluntary at the moment. This will flow from Phase 1 and will be looking to do some engagement with industry on Phase 2 whilst Phase 1 is ongoing. 	
GBG feedback is asking for a discussion on test house approval process, the criteria flowing from that, the cost effectiveness of the GC's current approach to testing and the quality outcomes. Potential feedback or analysis looking at the outcome of the tests completed. Need clarity on what the specific ask is, what the rationale supporting it is, what risks there might be to the licensing objectives and how those risks could be mitigated.	
PH will come back to GB with something more formal of what we think needs reviewing and the evidence around that and agree a timeline and approach. GB & NO left the meeting & PH handed over to Nigel D	on PH

4 Matters arising from ICE (CM) • Positive three days	

- Good footfall coming to see experts on the stand
- GBG launched our new Strategy
- LAs attended on the Thursday morning who spoke to a number of experts and had a tour around some members' stands. Interesting feedback from them around not knowing about tech standards, age estimation, limit setting and facial technology. GBG is following up with the IOL to raise the LAs knowledge more widely on land-based gambling.
- LAs are keen to have face-to-face engagement with GBG members

Two operators approached Eurocoin about GamCare messaging/helpline number being printed on the back of TiTO tickets and being a legal requirement. There are already tech standards on what is required on a TiTO ticket however, due to technology differences it is not ideal to set out what should be printed on the reverse of the ticket. GamCare information is being included on the reverse side of TiTO tickets now, where it is possible and is good practice. No further action required.

- To be the innovative lead on technology to meet industry's challenges

- What things do members want us to think about with creating new standards?
- Examples may be;
 - Use of cameras in machines and premises (even when there is one technology used in different machines the process that are being employed are different for the consumer). There might be a role for GBG to play as a central body to set out those processes so the consumer journey is the same regardless of technology.
 - Standards of age estimation should be similar regardless of technology so we have a reputable outcome for the consumer at the end.
 - Is there a need for 'floating licences' to be managed at a system level?
- GBG Members to come back to PH on areas where can add value.

	 Latest version of TiTO has been released that allows the system to tell the paystation (machine host) the maximum amount of the ticket value that can be returned onto the bank account linked to the original Ticket Purchase transaction. This feature allows the system host to protect against money laundering and other fraudulent activity. Limit settings for machines where the system host controls the existing machine base parameters for limit settings so that there is consistency across all machines installed onsite. The framework will be discussed at the next GBG Tech Forum meeting and an update provided at the next GBG MSG Meeting. Request from an operator to update the narrative within the GBG Promotional tech standard with a recommendation to game manufacturers to ensure that promo/cash match funds cannot be used on Poulette games.
