	Item 4(a) – Cashless transactions – we are setting up a working group to discuss the banking implications and PH is in the process of putting together an agenda. Mark Gibson, Howard Gant, Alan Humble, Rob Wheeler have agreed to sit on the forum. If anyone else wants to sit on this forum please let PH know.	Action PH
	Item 4(b) – Machines and Terminal Technology – too early to be talking too descriptively about terminal technology requirements but it is on our list to do.	
	Item 5 – Linked Jackpots – this was discussed with the Technical Forum but referred back to the operators for them to scope and provide a clear steer on the functional requirements. RW described the two types of typical	

linked jackpots; a) manufactured controlled (on their products only) or b) a linked jackpot to extend across multiple manufacturers.	Action PH

Machine Security Issues	
ND – the only issue is the MEI SC Advance which is mainly in the equinox cabinet. We understand it was a problem on the polymer £20 notes which has now been resolved.	
No other security issues were reported by Members.	
Cash Vulnerability Discussion	
Operators are looking to improve their safety measures individually and we all need to be engaged with this, make sure everyone is made aware of the problems when the arise. TB has a meeting with DCMS tomorrow and will raise this issue with them as part of the cashless conversation, but believes there is. PH advised that the Bingo Association initially raised this as one of the few remaining venue types on the High Street that still have to process	Action PH
 (a) <u>New Ways of Working</u> PH advised he wants to feedback some intelligence we have on the way the Gambling Commission are going to regulate in the foreseeable future. The comments that have come back from the regulatory team is that they are not planning on making any visits to operators (since the meeting the GC has now said that they will be recommencing site inspections from Oct 1st) they will be managing regulatory issues over Teams calls. They are looking at:- 	
 Understanding operator's activity on age verification and the challenges presented by mask wearing. Test purchasing and the reporting of results. Customer interactions and implementing the three stages 'identifying, interact and evaluate' which are taken from the Gambling Commission's guidance on interactions. They are also introducing the language of affordability and customer personal circumstances more and more into the dialogue. Self Exclusion. Money laundering and counter terrorism and proceeds of crime. 	
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	 Availability of machines re the 20% rule and the use of tablets and infill machines which PH thinks are to do with the newer venues that are opening up in previously used betting shops because of the constraints of the size of the venue. Local area risk assessment. 	
	With AGC's they plan to speak to the two biggest operators to start with then Motorway services and then work down the operator size.	
	ND advised that they have already had a zoom meeting with the Commission so they have already started.	
	If anyone wants any further information of this let PH know and, if necessary, we can then put out a communication.

6.	Standards and Protocols	
	PH advised he had a good conversation with Alan Claypole, who chairs the BACTA Technical Committee. Alan & PH have agreed to liaise every two months on what we are both doing – Alan is looking after the BACTA data port making sure it remains relevant and up to date and GBG will continue to focus on the development and maintenance of web services documents.	
	RW advised that there have been two Tech Forum meetings since June and will meet on a regular basis with the next meeting in November. The suggestion at the last meeting was to set up a Blog site so all the relevant technical people can start talking amongst each other in respect of any issues that come up.	
	We changed the narrative on the July call and agreed to make the promotional documentation clearer for machine hosts, and the game manufacturers on how they handle cash match.	
	We talked about EFT and the promotional functionality and the request from GPT to include promotional on cash match. There is a question on whether you should be playing promo or cash or first or not. The general rule is you play your promo funds first and then play cash (unless it is a cash match) So we are now looking into a third type of promo which is a cash match for EFT because the actual cash is injected at the service system level. There is work to do on this before the next meeting which will then be reviewed in a report back at the next meeting.	Action RW

 ME asked where we are at with the Code of Conduct cashless ATR transactions and the merchant ID – PH advised that some concern has been expressed about the risk of pursuing this now (and bringing attention to it) or wait until the White Paper is out from the Gambling Act Consultation. ME is concerned about merchant codes and credit cards being used in AGC's when they shouldn't be. TB advised that we are at a fairly important stage with the Gambling Commission and DCMS on cashless payments and have a meeting with them on the 15th September (to iron out the final social responsibility measure we might need to apply). The meeting agreed that the GBG should still look to get the Code of Conduct in place. 	
PH advised that as a first step we need to ensure GBG members agree not to have any of these merchant codes out there. PH will speak to David Lucas and move the Code of Conduct onto the next stage.	Action PH
